NUTRITION TIP OF THE WEEK FROM THE KSC FITNESS CENTERS: Did you know that the color of a vegetable can indicate the presence of vital nutrients? And in fresh foods, the color can tell you the condition of the nutrients inside. For example, a deep green vegetable that looks as if its turning yellow is not as nutritious as the one that's dark green. Listed below are some color/nutrient matchups:

- DARK GREEN: Broccoli, kale, collard greens, and mustard greens are high in bone-strengthening calcium
ORANGE: Carrots, sweet potatoes, and winter squash are high in beta-carotene, which may help fight cancer
RED: Beets and red peppers are high in vitamin C, which strengthens your immune system
WHITE: Cauliflower and parsnips are high in folic acid, which can help prevent birth defects and heart disease




